### Parent-Teacher Conference Success

### Keep Reading Over Winter Break!

Volume reading matters! There is research evidence that the amount of time reading is the best predictor of reading achievement. The more children read, the better they read. The better they read, the more they comprehend. The better they comprehend, the higher they achieve. Volume reading helps students build important word knowledge and acquire additional vocabulary, both of which are critical for reading comprehension.

Research aside, reading is fun! Make sure that your children start Winter Break with books they are excited to read. Add a trip to our local library as an outing over break. Plan some time to snuggle up and read a holiday classic to your children. Not only will you be building their reading brains, but you will be creating lasting memories and traditions centered around reading.

## District Superintendent's Message

Our Superintendent, Dr. Prater, recently posted a BLOG on the District website that included his perspective the recent presidential election and concerns about student safety. I wanted to assure our families that student safety is my number one priority and share his thoughtful BLOG post with you.

### Political Shifts and Feeling Safe in our Schools

The recent presidential election has raised concerns about certain students and families feeling safe in our schools. I have been told that a number of our families feel uneasy about attending public forums or school activities because of threats (or comments) made by our president-elect regarding deportation of certain groups during the recent election season. Some of our younger students fear their parents will be taken away from them while they are attending school. These fears are real and I am deeply troubled by them.

I want everyone to know that San Luis Coastal Unified School District is a welcoming, safe and supportive place for all of our families and students – regardless of ethnic origin, religious affiliation, or immigration status. SLCUSD reflects our community's values of inclusion, dignity, and respect. I emphatically stand up for our students' rights to feel safe at our schools and in our neighborhoods.

All administrators, school counselors, and staff are ready and willing to support any student who has concerns following our recent election. We stand firm against any form of harassment and are committed to ensuring every student is accepted and embraced.

## PTA Business Membership Highlight

IGL Pavers is owned by Ian and Alexis Gaffney and the company focuses on hardscape installations – pavers (Interlocking and Permeable) and retaining walls. ## Box Top Update


