## Follow The Outlined Procedure For The Youngest Age You Bring To School

### Drop-Off Procedures

• **Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, & Kindergarten:** Kids are required to be walked to and picked up from their classroom by an adult. *See Drivers That Park section.*

• **1st & 2nd Grade:** Use the drop off loop — the red zone in front of the office. Pull up to the curb and only allow kids to exit the car on the curb side. Do not leave your car in the loading/unloading area ever because it creates congestion and a dangerous situation. *See Drivers That Drop-Off section.*

• **3rd, 4th & 5th Grade:** Use the loading/unloading zone on Sequoia Street — marked with a white curb. Kids must exit on the curb side. *See Drivers That Drop-Off section.*

### Drivers That Park

Please drive up Sequoia Street and turn left into the first parking lot. Park and walk your child to school using the sidewalk.

### Drivers That Drop-Off

Drive up San Jacinto St. Turn left on Hemlock Ave. (**Greenwood Ave. is for walking and biking students only**). Turn left on Sequoia St. and drop off according to the outlined drop-off procedure for your age child (younger children use the drop-off loop, older kids are dropped off at the street). After you have dropped off your child, proceed down Sequoia St. toward Main St.

### Walkers

Walk up San Jacinto St. and turn left on Greenwood Ave. Traffic law dictates walkers walk against traffic (left side of the street).

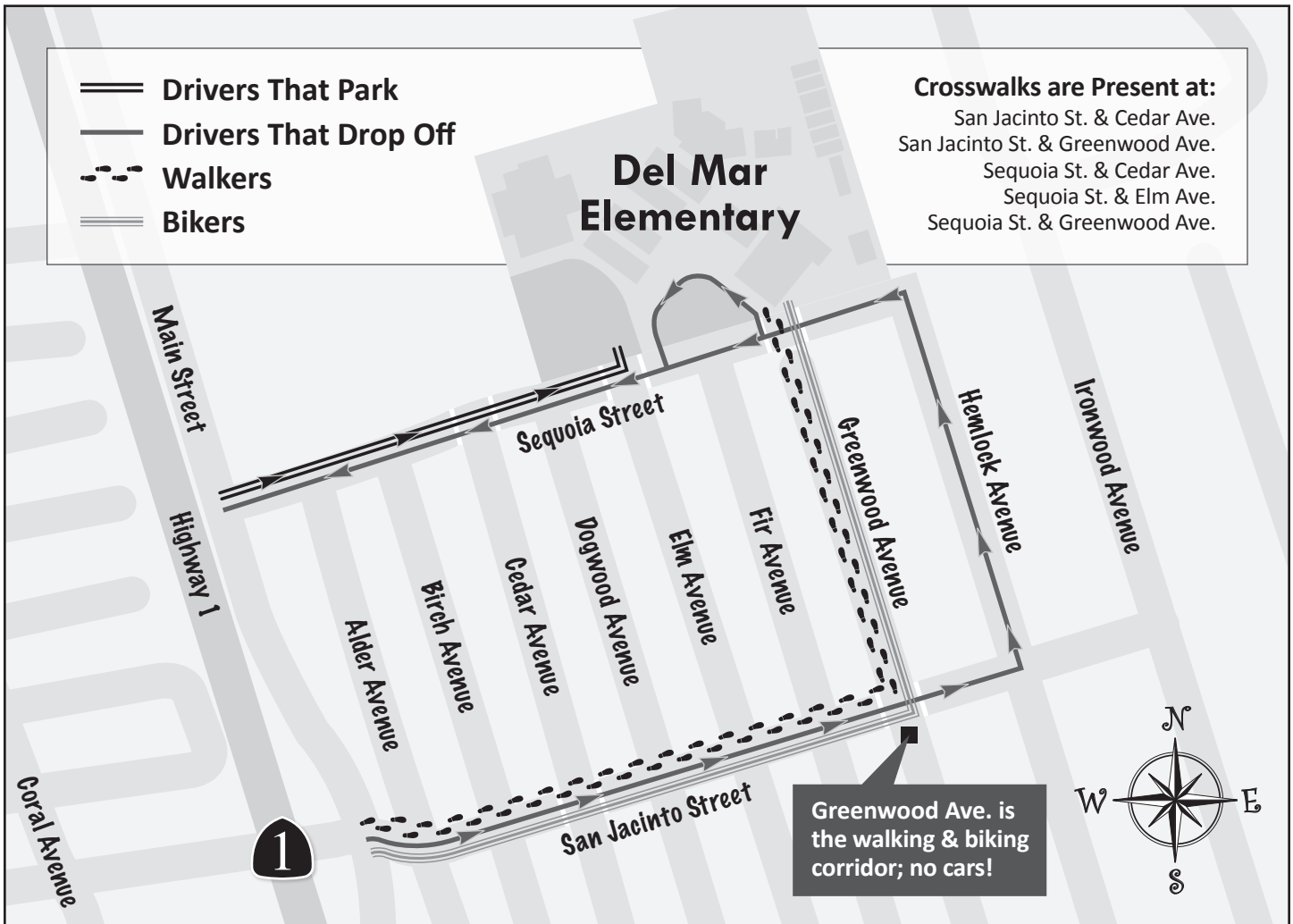
### Bikers

Ride up San Jacinto St. and turn left on Greenwood Ave. Traffic law dictates bikers ride with traffic (right side of the street) to the right of cars; safely merge into the flow of traffic and signal before you turn left. State law dictates children must wear a helmet when riding a bike. Children younger than third grade may not ride their bike to school unless accompanied by an adult.
